Padua in one day

If you arrive by train

morning



This itinerary is designed for those who have only one day to spend in Padua: in these few hours you will have the opportunity to get to know the city first and you will surely be encouraged to come back!

From the train station walk towards the center, along the wide Corso del Popolo. The first stop is at the Eremitani Civic Museums: from here you have access to the enchanting Scrovegni Chapel frescoed by Giotto (we advise you to read carefully, before arriving in the city, how to book a visit).

Adjacent to the museum complex is the Chiesa degli Eremitani, worthy of a visit that will take a few minutes.

Continue your journey towards the city center passing under the Porta Altinate: you have entered the pedestrian zone and you can enjoy a walk admiring the buildings and shops of the center

historian. It's time for a pleasant stop at the famous Caffè Pedrocchi, after which we recommend a visit to the Palazzo del Bo ', home of the ancient University.





afternoon



In the afternoon we propose first of all the Palazzo della Ragione, which will amaze you for the genius of those who designed and frescoed it. Now head towards Via S. Francesco, passing in front of the Tomb of Antenore, the founder of Padua according to legend, and Palazzo Zabarella, home of painting exhibitions.

Walking along Via del Santo you will arrive in a few minutes at the Basilica of S. Antonio, an undisputed destination of believers and art lovers that has become one of the symbols of our city.

Then continue along Via L. Belludi and get ready for the spectacular view of Prato della Valle, one of the largest squares in Europe.

Take a break for an aperitif before finishing off the day by choosing to visit the Botanical Gardens, UNESCO site, or the Basilica of Santa Giustina, an imposing church in

Renaissance style. If your legs are not yet exhausted, we recommend both!

The first stop is the spectacular Prato della Valle square, one of the largest squares in Europe.

Take a few minutes to visit the Basilica of Santa Giustina, an imposing Renaissance-style church. Continue along the route along Via L. Belludi to reach the Basilica of S. Antonio, undisputed destination of believers and art lovers that has become one of the symbols of our city.

A few meters from the Basilica you can visit the ancient Botanical Garden, Unesco site.

Continue your walk on Via del Santo: you will pass in front of Palazzo Zabarella, home of painting exhibitions, and the Tomb of Antenore, the founder of Padua according to legend.

Take a break for an aperitif in a pedestrian area and observe the liveliness of the squares in the historic center.





afternoon



In the afternoon we propose first of all the Palazzo della Ragione, which will amaze you for the genius of those who designed and frescoed it. Then take advantage of a visit to the Palazzo del Bo', home of the ancient University. Now is the time for a pleasant stop at the famous Caffè Pedrocchi, after which continue towards Piazza Cavour and Via Altinate.

Passing through the Porta Altinate you reach Piazza Eremitani: in front of you stands the Church of the Eremitani, worthy of a visit that will take a few minutes.



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
