Treviso in one day

Breakfast, Piazza dei Signori



morning



Before starting to visit Treviso, you can stop for breakfast at the Bar Beltrame: the prices are not really very low, but given its position, the price is justified. Right in front of the bar is the first stop of the visit: Piazza dei Signori. Here stands the Palazzo dei Trecento where, in the past, the municipal assemblies composed of three hundred members met. The building extends over the entire Piazza, merging with Palazzo Podesta and its tower, 48 meters high. Also in Piazza dei Signori it will be possible to visit: the Palazzo Pretorio, to the west, and to the south, between Via XX Settembre and Via Indipendenza, the first seat of the Municipal Library and Art Gallery, built in 1847.

morning



Going through the portico located between the Prefecture and Palazzo dei Trecento, you enter the "water zone", the place where the Sile river passes. From here you can reach the Pescheria, a small island that hosts the traditional fish market, where it is still possible to admire the mills, with their ancient wheels, and the spectacle of the buildings reflected in the waters.

Retracing your steps, skirting the Canal Cagnan, you reach the bridge of San Francesco: in this part of the city it is possible to walk quietly, enjoying the view of historic bars and mills, all framed by weeping willows.



Lunch, Porta San Tomaso, city walls, Paradise peninsula



afternoon



Crossing the complex of San Francesco and Viale Burchiellati, you reach the most elaborate of the three Venetian doors existing in the city: Porta San Tomaso. Venetian-Lombard building, the door has a rich facade decorated with trophies of arms, coats of arms, and the inevitable Venetian lion placed in the center.

Near Porta San Tomaso there is the Osteria Arman, where it is possible to stop for lunch, enjoying typical Treviso dishes at the right price. To digest it is recommended a walk along the walls of the city of Treviso, easily identifiable from the Porta. These were designed in 1509 to protect the town from the attack of Venice: they were then integrated by a hydraulic system, which flooded the surrounding countryside using the waters of the canals.

Moving along the walls you reach the Paradise peninsula, a green area where geese, rabbits and other animals are left free to live in peace.

afternoon



The walk continues with the Duomo, built on an early Christian temple, traces of which remain in Via delle Canoniche: the painting by Titian "L'Annunciazione" is preserved inside. Leaving the Duomo, thanks also to the efficient tourist signs, the church of S. Nicolò is easily identified, the second most important in the city. The Majestic building is embellished inside by twelve pillars, on which beautiful frescoes stand out: it is allowed to take pictures.

After the visit, returning to the Duomo area and Piazza dei Signori, the recommended destination is Calmaggione: the shopping street, lined with arcades and shops, very popular for the "struscio" of the weekend. Entering a gallery of shops on the left, towards Piazza dei Signori, the famous Fontana delle Tette crosses which, at one time, during the celebrations, dispensed white and red wine.
