Arena di Verona

Verona offers several paid parking options near the Arena (Arena Parking, P. Cittadella, and P. Isolo). After parking the car, you can reach the Arena on foot as it is located in the heart of the historic center and then enjoy a short stroll through the charming streets of Verona.

The Arena is the symbol of Verona and also one of the finest examples of Roman architecture. You can visit it by purchasing tickets at [this link](#).



Casa di Giulietta

Located near the Arena, Juliet's House is another iconic spot in the city. Starting from the Arena, you can reach it on foot by crossing Piazza Brà and heading towards Via Mazzini. After walking along Via Mazzini, just turn left, and you will find yourself in the courtyard where the iconic balcony is located. You can visit the house, but it is necessary to purchase tickets at [this link](#).



Piazza delle Erbe

Starting from Juliet's House, you'll need to follow Via Cappello until you reach Piazza delle Erbe. It's impossible not to notice it! Piazza delle Erbe is one of the liveliest and most charming squares in Verona, surrounded by historic buildings, cafes, and shops.

Here, you can admire the Madonna Verona Fountain and the Market of the Herbs, which offers a variety of local products. It is an ideal place to immerse yourself in the atmosphere of Verona's historic center.



Teatro Romano

The Roman Theatre of Verona is an ancient Roman amphitheater located in the heart of the historic center of Verona. From our location in Piazza delle Erbe, you will need to head west, retracing your steps on Via Capello until you reach the intersection with Via Leoni. Continue along Via Leoni until you reach the Roman Theatre, which will be on your right.

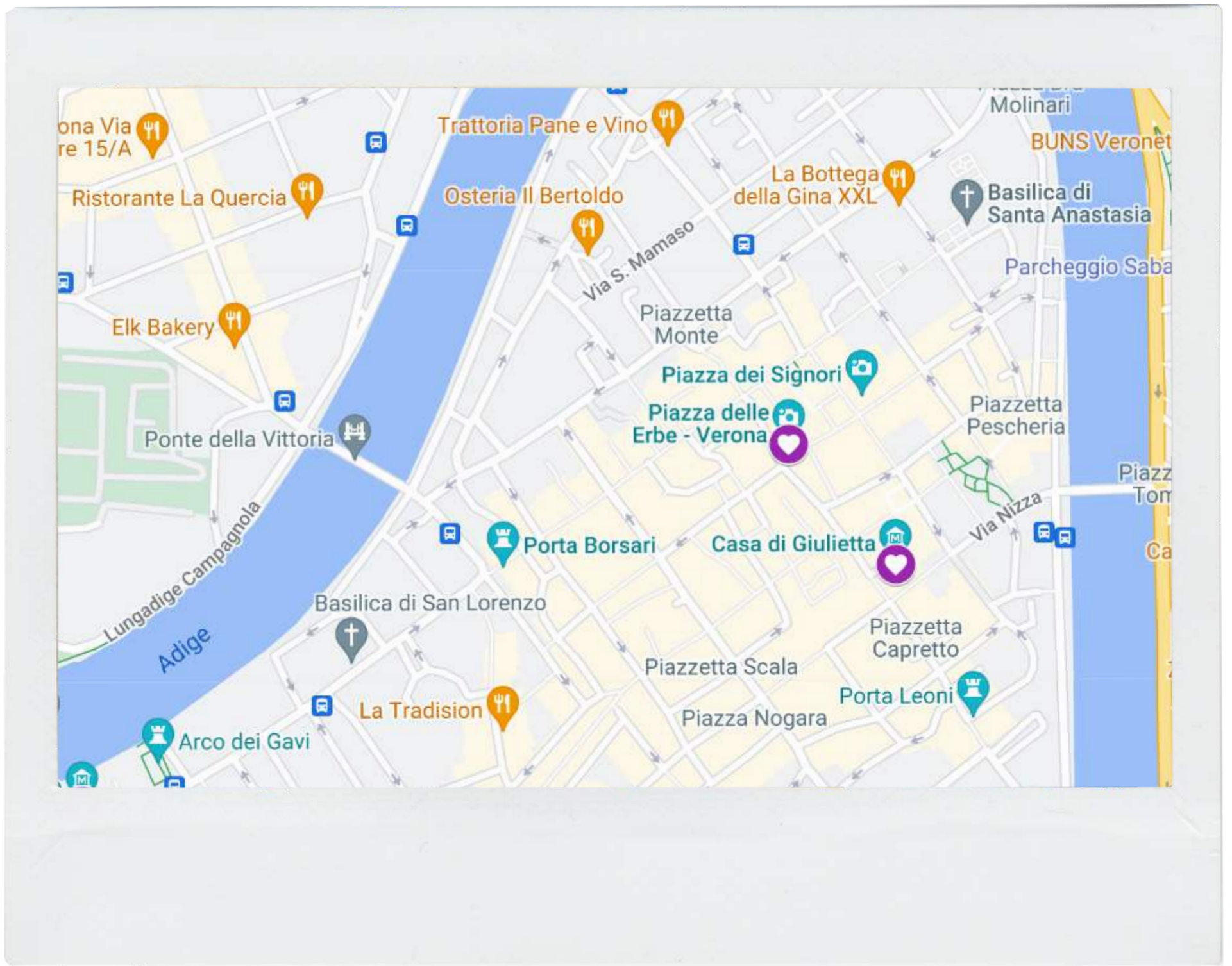
The Roman Theatre complex also features a fascinating archaeological museum, and you can access it by purchasing tickets at [this link](#).



Castelvecchio

This imposing medieval castle is now a museum that hosts an extensive art collection. To reach it, you will need to walk southeast along Via del Teatro Romano until you reach the Adige River. Cross the Ponte Pietra, one of the city's oldest bridges, and continue straight on Via Ponte Pietra until you reach Corso Cavour, which will end with Castelvecchio on the right.
